## GEO's Wind Systems Terms & Conditions (Rules)

Contractors are required to apply for small wind rebates on behalf of their residential customers.

Residential customers are defined as residential homeowners and landlords.

Residential rebates are available for Colorado residents only.

Applicants must own the wind system and contract with a company listed on the GEO Service provider List. Systems leased from a third-party are ineligible for the rebates.

An energy audit is required and must be performed on or after January 1, 2007; audits performed after April 19, 2010 must be performed by a BPI / RESNET certified auditor.

Small wind rebates are for new installations using new equipment only. The rebate is not valid on system add-ons, expansion or systems with used components.

Renewable Energy installations on new home construction are permitted provided that the new construction is either an ENERGY STAR New Home or the new construction has a HERS rating of 80 or less by the time the system installation is complete. An energy audit is not required for qualifying new homes.

The turbine used must be included on the eligible turbine list provided by the Governor's Energy Office.

Tower plans must be stamped by a Professional Engineer.

The system must be grid-tied and requires a 5-year full warranty.

Installation must be in compliance with all local and state ordinances. Proper permits are required.

Utility net-metering, interconnection and REC purchase agreements are required.

Applications are limited to one rebate per system type category per address.

Rebates are available on a first-come, first-served basis until funds are exhausted.

Local incentives may be available for small wind and will be used to determine the Governor's Energy Office rebate amount. The rebate paid by the Governor's Energy Office will not exceed \$1.00 per watt for the first 5kW, and \$0.50 for 5kW – 10kW. This rebate is calculated based on the turbine production at 11 meters/second determined by review of published manufacturer's information. The Governor's Energy Office assumes the residential applicant will apply for and claim all available local incentives and the total combined incentives will not exceed the state cap set forth of \$2.00 per watt for the first 5 kW and \$1.00 per watt for 5 -10kW.

Products and services undertaken for this rebate must be in accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act; for more information on the Act, visit <http://www.nps.gov/history/local-law/nhpa1966.htm>.

Rebate funds are reserved for an applicant once the complete Part 1 of the application is received, reviewed and approved; an approval letter will be issued if funds are available.

Failure to submit the proper paperwork within the stated application deadlines will result in the loss of the rebate reservation. If any of the program requirements are not satisfied, the residential applicant forfeits rights to the rebate.

Approved rebate applications will receive a rebate check, issued in the name of the residential applicant. Checks will only be mailed to a PO Box if a physical street address is provided.

The rights to a rebate or a rebate application may not be transferred or sold.

No term or condition of this application shall be construed or interpreted as a waiver, express or implied, of any immunities, rights, benefits, protections, or other provisions, of the Colorado

Governmental Immunity Act, CRS §24-10-101 et seq., or Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. §§1346 (b) and 2671 et seq., as applicable now or hereafter amended.

Fraud of any type could result in federal prosecution under the US mail fraud statutes. Any misrepresentation or fraudulent information disqualifies the rebate and may give rise to criminal or civil prosecution.

The Governor's Energy Office, State of Colorado and their partners are not responsible for lost, late, damaged, illegible, misdirected or postage-due applications. All rebates shall be governed by applicable state and federal laws. Resolution of any disputes will be governed by Colorado law. All terms, conditions and rules of the program are subject to change.

The Governor's Energy Office, State of Colorado and their partners are not responsible for loss or damages created by the contractor selected by the application to complete the system installation.

The GEO reserves the right to inspect all installations.

Please allow up to 4-6 weeks for delivery of the rebate after installation of the system and receipt of all required paperwork.
